

Our Vision

The Alabama Reading Initiative has the goal of ensuring all students can read by the end of third grade. Science of Reading Spotlight Schools bring a lab experience to literacy leaders in K-3 schools so they can see, envision, and implement Science of Reading structures other schools and districts have put in place to move data outcomes in a positive direction.

How Are These Schools Selected?

- Everything begins with data. Schools' outcome data in ACAP Reading and ACAP English Language Arts (ELA) with promising growth for 2nd and 3rd graders is our starting place for Science of Reading (SoR) Spotlight Schools. Data is viewed from 2022 to 2023 in both 2nd and 3rd grades, as well as vertical alignment of student data. Schools with the highest growth are more highly considered.
- Schools that exemplify a commitment to Student Centered Coaching to move students in their data and teachers in their practice are prioritized. This included their Results Based Coaching Tool submissions, coaching schedules, and adherence to the job descriptions in the law.
- Strong leadership structures in the building including data reviews (both school and individual students), action plans, master schedules with protected reading blocks for Tier 1 instructional time, intervention times, and a strong local reading specialist/ principal relationship are aspects SoR Spotlight Schools need to demonstrate.
- Strong participation in state funded and supported SoR trainings including Strong Leader; Strong Reader and Coaching Communities is expected.
- Utilization of aspects in the Alabama Literacy Act including Student Reading Improvement Plans, vetted High Quality Instructional Materials, and the Alabama Course of Study: ELA is an influence in the decision.
- A low turnover rate in teachers, a local reading specialist, and a principal is an important factor.
- Recognizing a spotlight school with various unique characteristics including school board district, regional in-service center, demographic populations, and specialized programming influence selections so schools can visit sites aligned to their needs.
