We are proud to have you as role models for future generations, and we are eternally grateful for your service. Thank you for your sacrifice, your bravery, and your love for our nation.

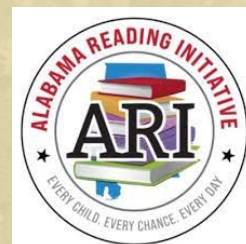





One-derful Wednesday



Throwback Thursday


